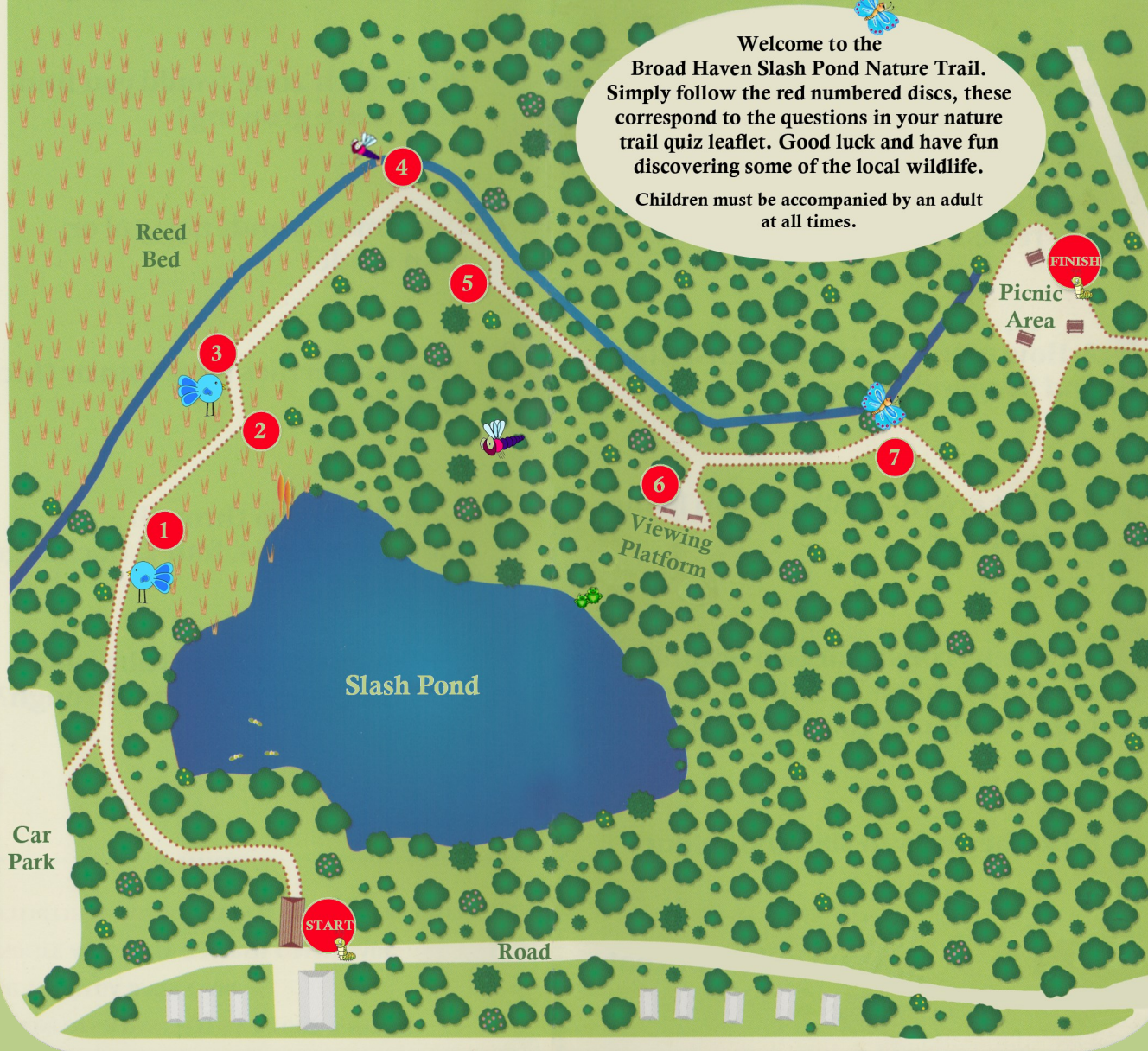


Slash Pond Nature Trail
