Quietly 'behind the scenes' volunteers womble away, keeping the boardwalk tidy, making and selling handicrafts to raise funds & applying for grants. This week we have a notable success!

Flora & Fauna Highlights:

As a community the Havens is renown for its welcome to all its visitors - be they staying for the season, en route to other places, visiting from overseas or looking to make a more permanent place to settle. So far 2017 has been no different and we are thrilled to welcome a wide range of visitors to the Slashpond and Boardwalk.

Already visiting Chiff Chaff, on their annual migration from the Mediterranean, have heralded the holiday season with their melodious song from tree tops. A rare sighting of a Cattle Egret on the Slashpond was a wonderful sight as it rested on its trip around the county from its home in Southern Iberia and the secretive Water rail has made an appearance – lets hope it decides to stay and allow us more opportunities to view such a beautifully plumaged bird in spite of its wonderful camouflage.

A pair of Moorhens have decided that this is not a bad place to bring up their brood of 11 chicks, but the lonely Mallard; once he found a mate, decided to travel elsewhere and we wish them well. The Splashpond Boardwalk is an alternative attraction to our wonderful Blue Flag beach. A sheltered 235 metre non-slip, paw friendly decked walkway surrounding a serene pond in a habitat that supports a wildflower meadow, a picnic area, willow dens, bug houses and bat & bird nesting boxes.

Parking at Trafalgar Terrace car park (along the seafront, turn left at the Galleon Inn, ¹/₄ mile on the left. Parking is free with a donation box at the entrance to help local community groups). Walk out of the car park, turn left, the walk entrance is 30 metres on the left. Sat Nav directions use SA62 3JU. Bring along a small net and enjoy the 'Dipping Deck' or test yourself with Nature Trail Quiz. The area offers a circular route of approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile which is accessible to motobility scooters, wheelchairs and pushchairs.

Other summer visitors are making the most of the resources on offer be it to wash in the pond as with Blackheaded gulls or swallows and house martins feeding on gnats and flies above the water.

Like any holiday destination some visitors choose to keep themselves to themselves so if you see any interesting characters enjoying the reserve do please inform us, for we know that we have such a rich wildlife habitat that is not always as obvious as we would hope.

We are not adverse to people either; whether you are a visitor or resident we hope that you too will make the most of the Boardwalk. Note new growth on those old apple trees that we pruned in Autumn much to the disgust of some locals who thought we had killed them off. In a couple of years we will be enjoying not only their blossom but their fruitfulness once again. Newly planted oak saplings reaffirm the prolific growth that Spring brings, in time the many newly scattered wildflower seeds will add further colour to the meadow areas. Keep your eyes and ears open and enjoy the atmosphere! David Meanwell
