Fire Update - Restorative Action:

A 'Restorative Order' enables those responsible to make good by way of a community service and were handed out to 3 people who caused the fire. On Saturday Oct 7th, volunteers of STB were joined by the three, their family members, local police & PCSO officers. The second bug house was rebuilt. It was agreed that this was a really constructive activity, plus cake and a good chat was enjoyed by all involved! Hopefully the 3 saw that community projects are a lot of fun, worth participating in and will have more appreciation for local amenities in the future!

During the afternoon, volunteers also pruned back the pathside hedging & brambles and strimmed the meadow grass, leaving it to lay for a week allowing the seeds to re-germinate back into the ground. 160 Daffodil bulbs were planted and we are all looking forward to a swift winter so that we can enjoy the new blooms in springtime!

Next Project:

A further site meeting has been held to finalise plans for the Birdscreen/birdwatching Pontoon. The idea is for a small pontoon to extend over the water; at the end of which there will be screens that will enable visitors to 'hide' whilst they watch the birds. The 'eyeholes' will be cut a different heights, allowing children, adults and wheelchair users all to enjoy. This brings us on to ...

The Slashpond Boardwalk is an alternative attraction to our wonderful Blue Flag beach. A sheltered 235 metre non-slip, paw friendly decked walkway surrounding a serene pond in a habitat that supports a wildflower meadow, a picnic area, willow dens, bug houses and bat & bird nesting boxes.

Parking at Trafalgar Terrace car park (along the seafront, turn left at the Galleon Inn, 1/4 mile on the left. Parking is free with a donation box at the entrance to help local community groups). Walk out of the car park, turn left, the walk entrance is 30 metres on the left. Sat Nav directions use SA62 3JU. Bring along a small net and enjoy the 'Dipping Deck' or test yourself with Nature Trail Quiz. The area offers a circular route of approximately ½ mile which is accessible to motobility scooters, wheelchairs and pushchairs.
