alternative attraction to our wonderful Seaside

The Slashpond Boardwalk is an

wonderful Seaside Award beach (the national standard for the best



beaches across the UK). At more than 350 metres, the boardwalk is a sheltered, non-slip, paw friendly decked walkway surrounding a serene pond in a habitat that supports a wildflower meadow, a picnic area, willow dens, bug houses and bat & bird nesting boxes.

Parking at Trafalgar Terrace car park (along the seafront, turn left at the Galleon Inn, 1/4 mile on the left. Parking is free with a donation box at the entrance to help local community groups). Walk out of the car park, turn left, the walk entrance is 30 metres on the left. Sat Nav directions use SA62 3JU. Bring along a small net and enjoy the 'Dipping Deck' or test yourself with Nature Trail Quiz. The area offers a circular route of approximately ½ mile which is accessible to motobility scooters, wheelchairs and pushchairs.

While these activities have been visible around the boardwalk, behind the scenes other efforts continue. Whether it's those of our gang with financial 'nouse' who keep our books in order for the likes of the work we've talked of above, the creative writers and designers amongst us who ensure our materials reflect the area and also the admin' types who oversee fundraising. Enhancements to the boardwalk area over the last year or so, have meant that the current nature trail quiz leaflets, downloadable from our website and the information boards and signs, are missing references to a number of its new features ...

... A new contemporary leaflet design, incorporating a fun quiz, pertinent information of the area and the boardwalk gang's activities, is ready to go to print ... we are in the process of applying for funds to action that. 'Watch this space.'

It's worth noting here that of course all of these on-going projects require funds. The recent final extension to the boardwalk was made possible thanks to a significant award from **Pembrokeshire County Council's Enhancing Pembrokeshire Fund.** It did however also need a sizeable injection of cash from funds raised by Support the Boardwalk. We are always very thankful for your support and help raising these monies. Now that we have completed that final extension and our cash reserves have taken a hit, we are applying to community funds for the new leaflets. If however, you are able to donate to boost those funds; you will find ways to do that on the **Fundraising & Donating** page of our website

A review of signs has also been conducted over recent months. Sign suppliers have been approached and funding applied for that too. As we go to press here, the good news is that we have just secured funding from Dŵr Cymru Welsh Water for that particular project. We are very appreciative of their Community Fund award which means that final touches can now be made to artwork for the signs and then we're good to go!

Managing and maintaining the boardwalk in these ways enables the Haven's locals and visitors to enjoy the habitat's flora and fauna. Don't forget; if you want to share the beauty of the boardwalk's birds, illustrated note cards are now on sale at The Beach Shop. Sold in biodegradable packaging they cost £4 for 8 cards, good value for a memento of your visit.
