Why did we create a leaflet?

Funding we received from Pembrokeshire County Council through the Enhancing Pembrokeshire fund has an objective to "address issues arising from second home ownership." Our projects present opportunities that second homes offer within the Havens i.e. the potential to increase visitors during off-season. By developing an accessible walk, a sheltered alternative is

offered to the sometimes windy traditional beach walk and the leaflet enhances that walk. Visitors from local towns and holidaymakers can enjoy the walk, the bird watching, pond dipping and quiz year-round. We have many informative signs displayed along the walk (in due course the new ones will feature) ... it's funny how one can pass something so often that you stop actually "seeing" it! So if you think you know about the Slashpond habitat, here's a chance to test yourself

So you think you know about the Slashpond eh?

- 6. 'Slash' derives from the word 'Slatche'. Is slatche a form of mining or someone who enjoys birdwatching?

The Slashpond Boardwalk is an alternative attraction to our wonderful Seaside Award beach

(the national standard for the best beaches across the UK). At

more than 350 metres, the boardwalk is a sheltered, non-slip, paw friendly decked walkway surrounding a serene pond in a habitat that supports a wildflower meadow, a picnic area, willow dens, bug houses and bat & bird nesting boxes.

Parking at Trafalgar Terrace car park (along the seafront, turn left at the Galleon Inn, 1/4 mile on the left. Parking is free with a donation box at the entrance to help local community groups). Walk out of the car park, turn left, the walk entrance is 30 metres on the left. Sat Nav directions use SA62 3JU. Bring along a small net and enjoy the 'Dipping Deck' or test yourself with Nature Trail Quiz. The area offers a circular route of approximately ½ mile which is accessible to motobility scooters, wheelchairs and pushchairs.
