

HOW TO POND DIP

A beautiful Dipping Deck has been created and offers superb opportunities for pond dipping.

Dipping your net or jar into the water is the best way to spot pond creatures.

- ❷ Bring along a container and a magnifying glass too.
- Sitting safely behind the bars, pop your net or jar through and into the water.
- Sweep through the water gently-as you do, try to scoop creatures from below the water as well as on the surface.
- Empty it carefully into your container and let the discovery begin!
- Return the creatures and the water back to the pond carefully.
- Have fun!

ABOUT BIRDWATCHING

The bird life of the Boardwalk is certainly varied so it is always worth stopping, looking and listening as even the most common of birds have their own unsurpassed beauty.

There are the visiting spring and summer migrants such as the Chiff Chaff, Reed Warbler and Blackcap to listen out for or Swallows to watch as they feed on surface water insects. Resident birds in full song as they claim territory, call for a mate or simply sing for joy, such as the Robin, Great Tit, Wren or Blackbird, never fail to disappoint.

The more observant will delight in Goldcrest, Long Tailed Tits, Reed Bunting or Little Grebe, whereas the rare sighting of Kingfisher and Water Rail contrast with the more visible Moorhen, Cormorant or Herring Gull of the Slash Pond.
