As part of the Welsh Championships and Round 2 in the Welsh Super Series, the Pembrokeshire Coast Triathlon was held on Saturday, June 16th. The Slashpond Boardwalk is an alternative attraction to our wonderful Blue Flag beach. A sheltered 235 metre non-slip, paw friendly decked walkway surrounding a serene pond in a habitat that supports a wildflower meadow, a picnic area, willow dens, bug houses and bat & bird nesting boxes.

Parking at Trafalgar Terrace car park (along the seafront, turn left at the Galleon Inn, ¼ mile on the left. Parking is free with a donation box at the entrance to help local community groups). Walk out of the car park, turn left, the walk entrance is 30 metres on the left. Sat Nav directions use SA62 3JU. Bring along a small net and enjoy the 'Dipping Deck' or test yourself with Nature Trail Quiz. The area offers a circular route of approximately ½ mile which is accessible to motobility scooters, wheelchairs and pushchairs.

Birdwatch pontoon & archway entrance

New signage installed, cut back & tidy up the bushes by the archway, plant some new bushes to fill in the gaps left while the contractor was working, rub down & stain the archway

Dipping deck

Pond reeds need clearing away from front of deck...by hand or mini digger? A pond dip to record the life and assess water health (...this could be an activity on the Family fun day?)

Meadow

Cut vegetation on sloping banks

General

Cut back growth along boardwalk - to allow sun light through to dry decking & avoid build up of moss

Remove & clean bird boxes (...this could be an activity on the Family fun day?)

Create warm spots for reptiles to bask on (or under) - put out corrugated roofing sheets or slates, so they can be checked/recorded on the family fun day?

Assemble the hedgehog houses and install (...this could be an activity on the Family fun day?)

Assemble piles of rocks or logs in a sunny spot; good for basking lizards (...this could be an activity on the Family fun day- check & record?)
