- get some expert guidance in to help us understand what animals & plants there are around the boardwalk & hopefully the pond too, to know what to look after & what might be a problem.
- solve some of the issues around the water-side plants needing attention – particularly the reeds, which without good management could cause problems for the life of the pond.
- turn our sights on trees that are blocking the viewing from the viewing platform & the plants that are making dipping from the dipping deck a bit tricky.
- continue to maintain the space for the boardwalk walkway, learning as we do about how to cut back the willow in a way that's good for all – healthy for the tree, simple to do & keeping out of walkers' ways for longer.
- be able to invite larger groups of people to come & do stuff! We look forward to when we can get many together safely.

'Support the Boardwalk' – Fundraising to Preserve and to Enhance

The Slash Pond Boardwalk is an alternative attraction to our wonderful Seaside Award beach (the national standard for the best beaches across the UK). At more than 350 metres, the boardwalk is a sheltered, non-slip, paw friendly decked walkway surrounding a serene pond in a habitat that supports a wildflower meadow, a picnic area, willow dens, bug houses & nesting boxes.



Parking at Trafalgar Terrace car park (along the seafront, turn left at the Galleon Inn, ¼ mile on the left. Parking is free with a donation box at the entrance to help local community groups). Walk out of the car park, turn left, the walk entrance is 30 metres on the left. Sat Nav directions use SA62 3JU. Bring along a small net and enjoy the 'Dipping Deck' or test yourself with our Nature Trail Quiz. The area offers a circular route of approximately ½ mile which is accessible to motobility scooters, wheelchairs and pushchairs.
